## July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks a Crowd Pleaser

July, 2004

An enthusiastic crowd of Lake Barcrofters gathered on Sunday, July 4 to watch the annual LBA fireworks display. The beaches were packed and the lake as well, as captains anchored their boats off Beach 3 to enjoy the festive occasion. Rain threatened to cancel this annual event, as it had the parade. But as one young fan said, "The suspense of it all – was it on or off – just added to the fun."

A mid-afternoon visit to the set-up site above Beach 3 revealed some interesting behind-the-scenes facts about the amount of work required for our 30-minute show. Five-year veteran Amon Nixson and Phil Kemelor were awash in mud, setting up rows of shell casings in wooden frames. (Other Newcomers helping out: Kevin Howell, Mark Goldberg, Mike Spivey, and Sue Nixson.) They worked alongside two professional pyrotechnicians from the Zambelli Company, based in New Castle, PA. The senior representative proudly stated that the Zambelli Company is "the largest fireworks company in the world and we have over 25,000 shows going off today."

The team of Lake Barcroft volunteers greeted the arrival of the shells at 2:00 p.m. At 6:00 p.m. they were joined by other Lake Barcroft volunteers, and once the decision was made to go forward, they began loading the rounds. The tireless volunteers would stay on the job until all the shell casings were checked and dismantled for the return trip to New Castle. By law, they are not allowed to leave the shells over night.

"Safety is our first concern," said Amon. Indeed, the entire affair is marked by extreme caution. The Fairfax County Fire Marshall visited the site to check the placement of the rounds and stayed until the show was over. Eager visitors to the setup site during the afternoon were politely, but firmly, escorted back away from the work zone. Great care is taken to protect the homes surrounding the set-up site.

To our good fortune, Lake Barcroft's show this year had a larger low-level display than normal. The main show was made up of 280 shells, while the finale had more than 240 rounds. For the curious, the shells are the size of baseballs, measuring 8 to 10 inches in diameter.

How does our fireworks display compare to the display on the Washington Mall? "Well, the shells used downtown are the size of watermelons and weigh 80 pounds. We may have a smaller show, but we definitely have a better looking crew of pyrotechnicians," Amon added.

The success of the fireworks at Lake Barcroft rivaled that of the show on the Mall. The reactions from the neighbors were overwhelmingly positive. "The beach vibrated; the colors were beautiful and the finale gorgeous. You have all the excitement of the fireworks without the driving and the crowds. We were at the beach and watching fireworks at the same time." George Waters summed it up for all of us. Congratulations to Amon Nixson and the rest of the LBA fireworks crew on a superb job of putting on the fireworks!

Event wrap-up: Korean Dinner at Han Sung Oak

At the Club's June dinner, we found out why Korean Americans from as far away as Boston and New York make a stop at Han Sung Oak (in Barcroft Plaza) part of their trip to the DC area. The food is simply excellent. Even Korea's First Lady stopped in during her husband's state visit.

Eunhee Roth, a resident of Whispering Lane who came to the US from Korea ten years ago, selected the menu. Everybody enjoyed the Korean barbeque and many side dishes. Eunhee told us about the formal style of Korean dining, how to properly toast the table's elder before beginning your meal (turn 20 degrees to the side), and how to pace yourself so you do not finish eating before he does! Eunhee also explained the many vegetables and side dishes that accompanied the beef grilled on our tabletops. It is said to be a very healthy cuisine. But—Eunhee warned us—Koreans use a lot of garlic, so kiss your spouse before you go, not after!

For those who couldn't attend this sold-out event, we recommend trying the following menu items. The consensus of the group was, we're all going back for more!!

- Hae Mool Pa Jun (pancake with scallions, shrimp, oyster bits, squid bits and seasoning)
- Goon Man Do (fried dumplings)
- Chap Chae (vermicelli noodles stir-fried with beef and vegetables in special seasoned sauce)
- ❖ Gal Bi (beef short ribs)
